The September 10, 2011 Meeting Agenda

This meeting will be presented by the Southeast Group. With Tom Callahan and Keith Neer presenting. When approaching a new woodworking project, many woodworkers struggle with the design process. Some feel there is something either magical or at least very artful which must take place to adequately design a project. Quite a few of us lack both sufficient skills in

either magic or art so we plow ahead and hope for the best. The discussion at our September meeting will be lead by Keith Neer and he will demystify design by sharing a process which, like all other aspects of woodworking, can be learned. Keith will share a design technique which starts with a simple inspiration and follow it though simple "doodles", quarter scale drawings,

model building, half scale drawings and full scale drawings. Along the way he will also discuss problem solving techniques and the construction of complex jigs required to achieve compound joinery.

Come prepared with your questions to enhance this interactive session.

2011-2012 Woodworking Contest

Contest Entry Information

Build anything that is primarily made of wood and completed between September 2011 and May 2012. It will be judged by the same criteria used in our past contests. Originality of design (how unique is it?), Functionality of design (how well does it work?), Artistic design (is it attractive?), Finish (sanding, stain, top coat) and Expertise required to complete (complex angles, joinery, inlay etc.). Photos may be used to enter projects in cases where it is not practical to transport and display. A PowerPoint presentation will be used to display digital entry photos again this year when the contest is judged at the May 2012 meeting.

If wish to have your digital photos included in the presentation, please send them to Darrell at dmcanulty@cincinnatiwoodworkingclub.org, no later than May 8th. And limit your photos to 4 per entry.

As part of the Woodworking Contest, we will present our 3rd annual Fred Weissborn Memorial Quality Award. It will go to the woodworker whose Contest entry is voted by members to best reflect the craftsmanship demonstrated by Fred during his long tenure as a member. The selection criteria will follow the principle that "craftsmanship" is in the eye of the beholder. Each voting member will determine the superior craftsmanship as he or she sees it and pick the best entry. This award is a traveling trophy with the winner's name and project inscribed on it.

We congratulate John Leonardi the winner of this prestigious award in May 2011. As a reminder The Steering Team has decided that a member may only win this award one time.

A winner is ineligible to compete for this award in any future contest. However, a winner remains eligible to compete for any other contest awards.

Principles of Making Veneered Furniture

Veneered furniture has a rich history but one which suffered from poor quality in the 1950's and 60's. The costly and uncertain future of dimensioned lumber requires that we consider, anew, the building of fine furniture while incorporating veneers. This day long course will demonstrate basic and advanced principles of building with modern veneering techniques. The following areas will be thoroughly discussed and demonstrated.

- Discussion and demonstration of required veneering tools
- Substrate and adhesive selection
- Veneering round and tapered table legs
- Veneering compound shapes
- Constructing a table top using modern hollow core techniques
- Edge banding
- Veneering with a vacuum bag vs. clamps
- Detailing your work

Finishing Veneered Furniture

Creating a flawless finish can be a challenge and finishing veneered furniture adds a level of complexity to the process. This course will demystify the finishing process and will demonstrate a number of techniques required to guarantee high quality results. Included will be:

- Discussion and demonstration of required finishing tools
- Selecting a spray system and
- Exhaust and spray medium alternatives
- Surface preparation and repair
- Selecting an appropriate finish
- Coloring wood
- Understanding the history development of clear coats
- Mixing your own finish
- Spraying vs. hand application of finish
- Finishing the finish
