Featured Speaker Dr. Jeffery Hill, MD

Dr. Jeffery Hill is an emergency room physician, an active woodworker and author of "Workshop Wound Care". He will be discussing the do's and don'ts of treating wounds in the shop and recommendations for a shop first aid kit. He will also talk about his book and its use.

His book is a field manual, not a medical textbook. The book is organized so you can quickly get to the information you need. If you cut, burn or crush a body part, you can turn right to the instruction you need to take care of the problem. So when, not if, you hurt yourself, you'll be back at the workbench in minimal time and with as little agony as possible.

Safety in the shop is the top priority for all of us. But when an injury occurs, proper and immediate care is paramount. This presentation will help you achieve this. Don't miss this one!!

For the last 8 or so years, a group of about 10 CWC members have been giving their time to keep the shop running and prep parts. They also lead outside volunteers in building tables from those parts for New Life's clients. Connie Stalf, volunteer coordinator, was at St. Xavier High School recently and accepted a check for \$1000 from St. X. and Magnified Giving. NLFB was nominated by one of the students, Kai Munz, who has been attending table build sessions with 8 or 9 other students on the first Saturday of the month since last November. Kai gave a very uplifting speech about how much his team liked building tables for people, why it was important to NLFB, what they learned from the woodworkers, and how much fun they had during the build sessions. It was their experience in our woodshop with the CWC team that made a big impression on each of them! Thank you Cincinnati Woodworking members for mentoring this group of students. Their school assignment for the year is over, but I'm sure many of them will be back to volunteer again because of your kindness.
