Methods of Work

Members of the NE groups will present several brief "Methods of Work" – handy hints for tools, safety, processes, or shop equipment. Dusty Eling will have a demo on a new type of Forstner bit with a replaceable tip.

Manuel Canales - Grinder Safety and Buying Used Tools

Manuel Canales will present some personal experiences related to shop safety. He will focus on bench grinder safety in particular. Also offered will be some suggestions to keep in mind when buying used power tools.

Keith Mealy - Biscuit Joinery

We've had a presentation on the Domino Joiner, one on Kreg Jig pocket screws and to round out the quick-joint triad, Keith Mealy will be presenting the plate, or biscuit joiner. If you think biscuits are only for alignment, you are just hitting the tip of the iceberg. Keith will talk about the complexities of "joint strength." He will show twenty different applications for plate joining. He'll talk about how to make the joints, how to lay them out, and even look at a couple of ways things can go wrong and how to prevent oops. We'll compare and contrast biscuits, Dominos, pocket screws, Beadlock floating tenons, dowel joints and traditional tenon joinery.

CHRISTIAN APPALACHIAN PROJECT

Not strictly a club-sponsored charity, but if you have old furniture being replaced by new, downsizing or settling an estate, New Life is a furniture bank re-distributing gently used furniture to needy families. From their warehouse in Blue Ash, they distribute furniture and household furnishings (dishes, small appliances, etc.) They accept drop-offs and will pick up larger items.

A furniture bank operates very much like a food bank, but they provide gently used furniture instead of food. They serve folks coming out of shelters who have overcome homelessness or fled an abusive situation.

The families served often move into their housing with only the items they were able to carry during their difficult period.
