He runs a business making and repairing string instruments – violins, violas, and cellos. Damon was born in Kentucky where his father was an opera director and his mother a school music teacher. He is both a voice and cello artist.</p> <p>He is a graduate of the University of Cincinnati College Conservatory of Music in 1993 and has played professionally along with his wife who plays viola. He wrote a paper about violin makers when he was in grade school and worked in a violin shop while in graduate school. He took it up as a hobby and his family encouraged him to enroll in the Violin Making School in Salt Lake City. As he grew in skills, his products were in demand in Cincinnati.</p> <p>He creates a few pieces a year taking meticulous care for detail using low tech, traditional methods and hand tools. New Life Furniture Bank

Since 2015 a growing number (15+) of CWC members have been leading the table build program at New Life Furniture Bank (NLFB) in Blue Ash. NLFB is a non-profit with the mission to provide furniture and other household items to individuals and families coming out of various unfortunate situations. In 2023 they provided over 33,400 items to 2278 households or 5482 individuals. NLFB works with over 65 referring agencies to qualify recipients and then provide them with furniture, beds, dishes, lamps, etc. for their new living space.

In 2023 club members contributed over 2400 hours of volunteer time. During this time, we expanded the woodshop into a different part of the facility, made various storage systems for internal operations and led approximately 400 community volunteers to build over 2100 dining, coffee, and end tables to be distributed to those in need.

I think you will find the club members volunteering at NLFB are pretty passionate about NLFB's mission. We are glad to be a part of providing a furnished home to people that need some help. NLFB serves the Northern Kentucky, Cincinnati, and Dayton areas. If you have furniture you are looking to rid yourself of, consider donating to NLFB. Parking Information

There are multiple places to find a parking spot.

- Handicap parking by the Reading Rd side of the receiving docks and on Benson St in front of the store. Handicap permits only. Receiving dock is available to unload and pick up items. Once unloaded, you must find other parking.
- Lot across the street from Mueller. Lot has parking spaces striped with Entrance and Exits marked. About 25 to 30 spaces.
- Mueller upper customer lot for May and September meeting only (when store not open to public). About 12 spaces
- Street parking on Mueller side of Benson and both sides on 3rd Street, north and south of Benson
- Shut down Rally's restaurant at the corner of Benson and Reading across the RR tracks from Mueller. About 30 spaces (assuming it's not being re-developed)
- Reading Public Parking Lot across from Rally's, About 20 spaces
- Lot across the alley in back of the American Legion parking lot, next to RR tracks. Enter the American Legion from Reading road. About a block from Mueller using the alley and McDonald's lot. About 30 spaces.
