With innovative new tools, their product line is expanding. Some tools carry the Campbell Hausfeld brand, but others are marketed under private labels.

Liz Gradwohl, Consumer Insight Specialist, and Product Manager **Jesse Moore** will be at our November meeting. They will explain how you can set up a spray booth in your workshop and give a short PowerPoint presentation. They also plan to show their new Aluminum Compressor and do some nailing demonstrations.

HANK VON HOLLEN lives in the Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania area and has developed and patented a unique **Universal Jointer**. Taking an early retirement in 1986 from his mechanical engineering career with Westinghouse, he designs and builds about five large solid-wood Heirloom pieces per year for his family that includes 9 grandchildren. Producing pieces that current and future generations will treasure, has been his passion. An Heirloom Tool Chest of his was featured in Woodwork magazine. His casework uses 18th century period and functional Shaker joinery, but created by modern means. Being dissatisfied with commer-

cially available dovetail fixtures, he developed, patented, and now sells his unique **Universal Jointer**. Without needing any trial & error cuts, he will demonstrate its simplicity, safety and versatility by making cuts of **Through, Half-Blind and Sliding Dovetails, Box and Tenon Joinery**. All of the drop-in templates for these are included with units that will be available for sale at the meeting for \$199.

CWC 2007-2008 Woodworking Contest

The Challenge: Build a SMALL TABLE

The purpose of the Contest Program is to encourage and invite participation in a woodworking project, to share ideas and expertise and to compete against your peers.

The contest will be held at the last meeting of the year. Members will have the entire year to work on their contest entry, but the entry does not need to be made during the year. It could be something you made a long time ago that you are really proud of.

This year's contest will be to build a small table. It can be any kind of table **as long as the surface area of the table top does not exceed four square feet**. It could be an end table, a plant stand, a bed side table a coffee table or a telephone stand. The table can be any kind of table, any style, any construction, **as long as the surface area of the table top is no more than 576 square inches**.

There will be two groups of contestants: the Previous Winner's group (those who have won first, second or third in the previous contests) and the General Population group (everybody else). Every member will be given a ballot at the May meeting. The Previous Winner's group will be designated as entries 201-215 and the General Population will be designated as 100-199.

The members will vote for first, second and third in the General Population group and in the Previous Winner's group. You can only vote for an entry once and you cannot vote for your own project. A first place vote counts three points, a second place vote counts two points and a third place vote counts one point. The votes will be totaled and the most points will be awarded first place, second most points second place and so on.

The entries will be judged using five criteria:

ORIGINALITY OF DESIGN (How unique is it?)

FUNCTIONALITY OF DESIGN (Is it something you would want in your home?)

ARTISTIC DESIGN (Is it pretty?)

FINISH (sanding, stain, top coat)

TECHNICAL EXPERTISE (complex angles, joinery, inlay etc.)

Winners will be announced at the May meeting. 1st, 2nd, 3rd place and Honorable Mention winners will receive ribbons. And their projects will be featured in the newsletter and posted on our web site.

So let's get busy and share your ideas for the best wooden table you have made or can make this year!
