Western Ohio Woodworkers member Tom Lensch will provide a presentation on making three dimensional interlocking wooden puzzles. Tom's puzzles are built to accuracy on the order of several thousands of an inch. Tom will discuss different aspects of making wooden puzzles including tools, tool setup, methods for achieving wood cutting and jig design. His expertise has provided him the opportunity to travel around the world and the United States meeting with other puzzle designers/makers.

Many thanks to all who contributed to the 2022 Toy Project. We collected 423 handmade toys, games, boxes, and pens this year from our members, along with a few other donations. Most went to Cincinnati Children's Hospital after we lost our previous recipient, the Christian Appalachian Project. Smaller quantities were given to the New Life Furniture Bank for sale in their thrift store to support their mission, and also to the Mary Haven Youth Center in Lebanon. The toys were greatly appreciated by all.

Children's Hospital has a need for and will accept toys year-round, so you don't need to wait until next Christmas to become part of this project. The Woodworking Club has wood available for toy projects, along with a wide variety of toy parts for anything you might want to build.
