We Need Help

CWC is a volunteer run organization. We currently only have about 10% of the membership involved in helping run the organization. As with most things, the more you give, the more you get. We are currently in need of help in several areas.

- Co-Chairs. Each of the five neighborhood groups organizes one meeting a year. You do not need to be in the geographic areas named to help with this.
 - Stephen Fridrick has come on as co-chair for the NE group. As Manuel Canales is moving out of the city, Stephen can use some help as co-chair.
 - o Bill Fee would like a co-chair for the SW group.
- CAP coordinator George Murphy would like to step down from being the CAP toy drive coordinator. This involves interfacing with the CAP staff and making toy plans and information available to club members. George can help with the transition and has a job description.
- George Murphy is downsizing and has four containers of club owned toy parts to give to members on request. They include wheels, axle pegs, wooden balls, half-balls, a few games, and other random items. None of the four containers are larger than 16" or 18" cubes Can anyone take these and distribute as needed?
- Web development & maintenance. Darrell McAnulty has done a tremendous job bringing our club web site current with technology. He would appreciate some help keeping it going forward. If you have or want to develop web-development skills this is a great opportunity. Many new members have found us via the web site.
- Methods of Work. A 'methods of work' is a short presentation of ideas that you can use in your shop, similar to the subscriber shop tips in the front of magazines. At each meeting we try to have a number of these short presentations by members on various topics. Even if you have a process that you think everyone knows, they probably don't (just look at handy hints published in the magazines each issue). Sign up at any meeting and you'll be added to the list to present at a future meeting. Topics can include: Safety, Sharpening, New (or handy) tools or materials, ligs and Fixtures, Finishing or general Shop Tips.
