The Southeast Group has a great meeting planned for November.

Donna Hill is a R&D Scientist by day and a woodworker during the evenings and weekends. With a shop set up in part of an old tobacco barn on a small 35 acre farm in Verona Kentucky, her interest in furniture design focuses on the details; from bell flowers and stringing to marquetry and stone inlay.

She has had the privilege of studying with Steve Latta on a variety of decorative details and learned marquetry under the tutorage of Paul

Schurch and Silas Kopf.

Donna has taught basic parquetry and marquetry in the Cincinnati area and has worked for Popular Woodworking during the Woodworking in America SketchUp workshops.

She has generated SketchUp working drawings for furniture ranging from the Federal Period to Contemporary designs. She will be teaching at Marc Adams School of Woodworking in 2011, offering a weekend course in Basic SketchUp. As a member of SAPFM (Society of American Period Furniture Makers) she demonstrated the creation of

pateras (a shallow drinking bowl) at the WIA conference this past October.

At the November meeting, she will do a whirlwind of demos for CWC. She plans on covering a gambit of woodworking embellishments such as: basic marquetry/parquetry, stringing and bellflowers and inlay with stone and metal. Most of this work will be performed with hand-tools but she will point out where you can make the work “louder” with the occasional use of a power tool.

## 2010-2011 Woodworking Contest

Build anything that is primarily made of wood and completed between September 2010 and May 2011. It will be judged by the same criteria used in our past contests. Originality of design (how unique is it?), Functionality of design (how well does it work?), Artistic design (is it attractive?), Finish (sanding, stain, top coat) and Expertise required to complete (complex angles, joinery, inlay etc.). Photos may be used to enter projects in cases where it is not practical to transport and display. A PowerPoint presentation will be used to display entry photos again this year when the contest is judged at the May 2011 meeting.

As part of the Woodworking Contest, we will present our 2<sup>nd</sup> annual Fred Weissborn Memorial Quality

Award. It will go to the woodworker whose Contest entry is voted by members to best reflect the craftsmanship demonstrated by Fred during his long tenure as a member. The selection criteria will follow the principle that “craftsmanship” is in the eye of the beholder. Each voting member will determine the superior craftsmanship as he or she sees it and pick the best entry. This award is a traveling trophy with the winner’s name and project inscribed on it.

We congratulate Keith Neer as the first winner of this prestigious award in May 2010. At Keith’s suggestion, the Steering Team has decided that a member may only win this award one time. A winner is ineligible to compete for this award in a future contest. However, a winner remains eligible to compete for any other contest awards.

### Fall Seminar - SketchUp with Robert Lang of Popular Woodworking.

Have you been thinking about designing your projects on the computer using CAD? This might be the seminar for you. Robert Lang from Popular Woodworking will be spending a day with WOW teaching the basics of using SketchUp. SketchUp is a free three-dimensional modeling software application available from Google by going to <http://www.sketchup.google.com>. It enables you to plan and

visualize projects on your computer, not as static drawings, but as models you can take apart and put back together, and view from any angle. By using a CAD program to design your projects, you can zoom in to look at a joint, disassemble it, measure the parts and even look at it with X-ray vision. It also makes it easy to print drawings of your project including printing the entire project or specific sub assemblies with details and dimensions.

SketchUp is a CAD program that comes in multiple versions. The basic version can be downloaded and used for free with upgraded versions available for a nominal fee.
