While building commissioned pieces and teaching on a limited basis, he enjoys investigating new designs of more traditional pieces.</p> <p>Born and raised in Wheeling, WV. he was first exposed to woodworking in the Scouts. Subsequent education was obtained in junior high school Industrial Arts classes. As a teenager he worked on carpentry crews during the summer. After leaving college, he spent 15 years in the sheet metal trade, and then spent over two decades as an air traffic controller.</p> <p>While working as an air traffic controller a friend re-ignited his passion for woodworking. Then, while on vacation in Maine he happened upon a Windsor chair shop. The shop was housed in an 18th century barn and the house was used as a showroom. It was there, in that shop, that he realized he wanted to add Windsor chairs to his portfolio.</p> <p>His chair making education began at the Windsor Institute. Then continued with Curtis Buchanan and Chris Williams while learning specific aspects of chair making from Greg Pennington, Peter Galbert and Don Weber. Ray gives credit for his chair making adventure to his friendship with the aforementioned makers along with Megan Fitzpatrick, Brendan Gaffney and most assuredly Chris Schwarz. Chris also provided the opportunity to teach chair making at the Lost Art Press storefront, fulfilling one of Ray's dreams.</p>
