### Classes to be Offered at Hardwood Lumber & More

Donna Hill is teaching a Line & Berry Class will be held Jan 22, 2011. If you go to the HL&M website, listed below, you can register for the class under the "Events" Tab. Details about the class have not yet been listed under the "Class" section. This will be a demo class with some hands-on work - The class should be about a 2 to 3 hours, depending on how much people want to practice during class. The class fee should be listed on HL&M website this coming week. **The series of SketchUp classes (6 total) starts in February - Class 1 & 2 are Feb 12 and 19 respectively - these two classes will cover the basic introductions and will include handouts and examples for wood workers. Mar 5th is Class 3, Mar 19th Class 4, April 9th Class 5 and April 16th Class 6 - these classes will get into more detail and will be accompanied by handouts and "homework" for wood workers.** The outlines for the SketchUp classes should be posted on the HL&M website by the end of this week. The series will be organized so that if you are someone who has some SU working knowledge and want to get into more details - you could skip the first maybe even the second class. **If you are a total novice - start at the beginning.** The SketchUp classes are \$30 per class, 2 hours of "instruction" with an additional hour for Q & A and hands-on work. There might be a 10% discount if you sign up for all 6 classes up front. A laptop will be required if you really want to get something out of the classes. As a point of reference, If one were to take a class covering this breadth of information at one of our favorite woodworking schools- it would cost them about \$250 plus expenses and occur in an intense two day time frame. There are several other classes at HL&M by other instructors over the next couple of months that CWC members may be interested in - cabinet making, relief carving, drawer making, finishing etc. Check out the website for more info.

## 2010-2011 Woodworking Contest

Build anything that is primarily made of wood and completed between September 2010 and May 2011. It will be judged by the same criteria used in our past contests. Originality of design (how unique is it?), Functionality of design (how well does it work?), Artistic design (is it attractive?), Finish (sanding, stain, top coat) and Expertise required to complete (complex angles, joinery, inlay etc.). Photos may be used to enter projects in cases where it is not practical to transport and display. A PowerPoint presentation will be used to display entry photos again this year when the contest is judged at the May 2011 meeting.

As part of the Woodworking Contest, we will present our 2<sup>nd</sup> annual Fred Weissborn Memorial Quality

Award. It will go to the woodworker whose Contest entry is voted by members to best reflect the craftsmanship demonstrated by Fred during his long tenure as a member. The selection criteria will follow the principle that “craftsmanship” is in the eye of the beholder. Each voting member will determine the superior craftsmanship as he or she sees it and pick the best entry. This award is a traveling trophy with the winner’s name and project inscribed on it.

We congratulate Keith Neer as the first winner of this prestigious award in May 2010. At Keith’s suggestion, the Steering Team has decided that a member may only win this award one time. A winner is ineligible to compete for this award in a future contest. However, a winner remains eligible to compete for any other contest awards.
