#### WhaJa Make WhaJa Get


#### **CWC-Central Group**

## 2010-2011 Woodworking Contest

# Build anything that is primarily made of wood and completed between September 2010 and May 2011.

It will be judged by the same criteria used in our past contests. Originality of design (how unique is it?), Functionality of design (how well does it work?), Artistic design (is it attractive?), Finish (sanding, stain, top coat) and Expertise required to complete (complex angles, joinery, inlay etc.). Photos may be used to enter projects in cases where it is not practical to transport and display. A PowerPoint presentation will be used to display entry photos again this year when the contest is judged at the May 2011 meeting.

As part of the Woodworking Contest, we will present our 2<sup>nd</sup> annual Fred Weissborn Memorial Quality Award.

It will go to the woodworker whose Contest entry is voted by members to best reflect the craftsmanship demonstrated by Fred during his long tenure as a member. The selection criteria will follow the principle that "craftsmanship" is in the eye of the beholder. Each voting member will determine the superior craftsmanship as he or she sees it and pick the best entry. This award is a traveling trophy with the winner's name and project inscribed on it.

We congratulate Keith Neer as the first winner of this prestigious award in May 2010. At Keith's suggestion, the Steering Team has decided that a member may only win this award one time. A winner is ineligible to compete for this award in a future contest. However, a winner remains eligible to compete for any other contest awards.

The emphasis of this year's seminar is on using Jigs, Fixtures and Common Sense Approaches in the shop to get the most out of your power tools. Doug Dale and Zane Powell will team up to demonstrate a variety of jigs, fixtures and techniques to help you achieve satisfying results for your projects. The table saw, band saw, planer, jointer and router will be featured. Other tools and techniques may be used in some of the demonstrations.

This seminar goes beyond a presenter standing behind a table holding up an object and explaining its use. These demonstrations will be on actual equipment.

#### **Biographies:**

<u>Doug Dale</u> has worked at Marc Adams School of Woodworking (MASW) for 10 years and is in charge of student affairs and all the in-house maintenance. At one time, he held the record for the most classes attended in one summer--17. He obviously has completed his Masters, and in 2005 taught his first class at MASW along with Zane Powell on Machine Maintenance, Jigs, and Fixtures. When Doug is not working at the school (or driving to and from the school--he lives in Ohio and drives more than 100 miles one way each day), he is working in his shop making furniture and cabinets and dabbling in restoration. He is a dedicated employee who has motivated and inspired everyone through his wit and enthusiasm. Doug has lectured nationally for the Consumer Woodworking Expo.

Zane Powell has been a professional woodworker for more than 30 years. In 1987 he supervised the residential cabinetry division at Classic Woodworking, specializing in design and building complicated casework. In 1992 he started his own company that specializes in fine furniture. He has been the lead assistant at MASW since it started in 1992. His work has been featured on the front cover of Builder Architect magazine and in Indianapolis Monthly and Better Homes and Gardens' Wood magazines. Zane is one of the reasons our school is what it is today.

Doug and Zane are noted for providing entertaining and informative classes. Get ready for a fun day of learning.
