The Southeast Group presents this September Program.

Scrollsaw Creations Gary Terborg will talk to us about using a scrollsaw. Gary is an accomplished Scroller and has many articles published in Scroll Saw Magazine. He has won first place at the Ohio State Fair for his scrollsaw work. He also teaches at Woodcraft.

Hand Cut Dovetails Paul Sanow will speak on “Dovetails the Old School Way (or Put Down that Router!)” Some call it the “mark of craftsmanship”. That may be a bit over the top, but it doesn’t take a bunch of expensive machinery to cut nice looking dovetails for a drawer or case. The masterpieces of American Furniture were built using simple hand tools, so you can too. With just a chisel, mallet and hand saw you can lay out and cut this joint after a little practice. We’ll talk about the joint, why it works, and demonstrate both through and half-blind dovetails.

Show and Tell

We have *Show and Tell* at every meeting. We all get inspiration and ideas from seeing what others have done. Let’s see what you have been up to “share the woodworking knowledge”

If you are mailing your dues to Dick, include a self addressed stamped envelope, and he will mail you membership card to you.



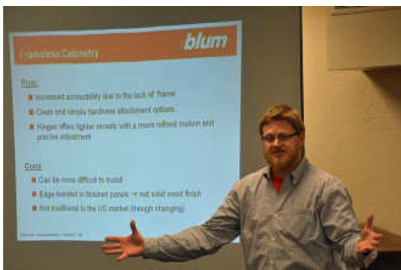

Safety Requirements for Toys

- NO FINISH OF ANY KIND, even though you believe it is "safe". This includes printed decals and felt pen decoration.
- NO VINYL PARTS
- SMALL PARTS
 - Check for small parts whether attached, removable or as a separate piece using the small parts test cylinder. Area group leaders have test cylinders available or bring parts to the meeting.
 - If attached, small parts must be firmly secured to resist 15 lb pulling force. We recommend using two different securing methods on small parts, for example glue plus nail or screw. Pull testing is available at the meeting.
- CORDS, ROPE, & STRING
 - Pull cords for pull toys can be of any length but they cannot have any knots, ball or handle on the pull end. Pull end of cord cannot exceed the diameter of the cord itself.
 - Cords, rope or string other than pull cords must be less than 12 inches in length.
