THE JANUARY 2007 MEETING AGENDA

The Northwest Group will conduct this month's meeting.

All woodworkers are impacted in one way or another by dust generated in our workshops. Northwest Group members **George Murphy, Gene Earnest and Basil Maddox** with the input of many club members and suppliers have created a broad-based treatise on the subject of dust. **Gene Earnest** will identify the Health, Fire and Explosion hazards & risks. **George Murphy** will follow up with important Concepts and Design Criteria for dust collection systems. You will come away with new under-

standing, printed material and links to resources helpful for improving your system or designing new.

Dennis Reed, also a member of the NW Group, and manager of the local Woodcraft Store, in collaboration with **Gary Berling**, who has taught Scroll Saw Intarsia at Woodcraft, will discuss the Scroll Saw. We will learn what it can do, the history and evolution of design, blade configuration options, models & features and how to choose.

Ray Ladouceur will round out the agenda with a Woodworking 101 topic of generating cutting lists. Us-

ing a simplified example and computer software called **CutList Plus**. He will show us how basic features will assist you in project planning and printing out optimized cutting diagrams for sheet goods.

TOYS FOR CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL

CWC has enthusiastically volunteered for a special toy project for Cincinnati's Children's Hospital. By crafting and donating toys, puzzles and boxes we hope to help make life a little brighter for the children undergoing treatment. CWC members and non-members alike are encouraged to help out.

Jerry Jones and **John Leonardi** are coordinating.

We are currently including these three items:

1. Memory box - the same size as a cigar box. 8.5" x5.5" x2.5". It should have a lid. A sliding lid is a type that works well and doesn't require a lot of work. The box should not be finished. The children will work on decorating them.
2. Any wheeled small toy like a car or truck .
3. Various cutouts out of 1/4" or 3/8" wood. Patterns are available on the Web Site or if anyone has good dinosaur patterns by all means use them. The children will decorate and hang them up. Unless the cutouts are meant to be sitting on something, please drill a 3/16" hole so they may be hung with a string.

Completed projects may be dropped off at Woodcraft in Fairfield. Put a tag on your bag or box, addressed to John Leonardi and include your name. Projects may also be dropped off at Sears Hardware in West Chester, Ohio. Put a tag on your bag or box, addressed to Jo Nall and include your name. If you have some completed items and Woodcraft or Sears Hardware is not convenient, call either Jerry or John for arrangements and for any other questions.

DeWalt Tool Recalls

DeWalt is recalling over 44,000 **Model RDC305 Reciprocating Saws**. This recall involves the cordless DEWALT **DC305** model reciprocating saws with **date codes 200601-49 through 200640-49**. The model number is located on the name plate on the side of the housing and the date code is located under the handle where the battery is inserted. These units are a fire hazard.

DEWALT is also recalling over 81,000 **Model DW660 Cut-Out Tools**. The model number is written on their nameplate, which is located on the body of the unit. The recalled tools were manufactured between January 2006 and September 2006, and have **date codes** ranging from **200601 to 200639**. The date code also is located on the tool's nameplate. Units with a "V" stamped on the nameplate are not included in this recall. These units are a shock hazard.
