Date: January 8, 2005

From the North and East

Take I-275 to exit #39, Winton Rd. exit. Go south on Winton Rd. approximately 5 miles to Compton Rd. Turn left onto Compton Rd.

From the South

Take I-71 or I-75 to the Ronald Reagan Highway. Go west to the Winton Rd./Galbraith Rd. exit. Turn left onto Galbraith Rd. Turn right onto Winton Rd. Follow Winton approximately 1.2 miles to Compton Rd. Turn right onto Compton Rd.

From the West

Take I-275 to the Ronald Reagan Highway. Go east to the Winton Rd. North exit (second Winton Rd. exit). Follow Winton Rd. approximately 1 mile to Compton Rd. Turn right onto Compton Rd.

Hazard: The blade drive mechanism may loosen or the motor can separate from the tool. Loosening of the blade drive mechanism can result in kickback of the item being sawed, resulting in possible laceration. Motor unit separation can cause the coasting saw blade to damage the saw wiring resulting in possible electric shock, or the separated motor could strike the user and cause injury.

This simple jig allows you to evenly space flutes from one to seven precisely and with little fuss on boards up to 12" in width.
