## Next Meeting

Date: September 11, 2004

Time: Room opens at 8:30 AM, the meeting is from 9:00AM to 12:00 PM.

Location: Northminster Presbyterian Church 703 Compton Road. Located in Finnytown, 703 Compton is East of Winton Rd. approximately .2 mile on the South side of Compton Road. ### **From the South**

Take I-71 or I-75 to the Ronald Reagan Highway. Go west to the Winton Rd./Galbraith Rd. exit. Turn left onto Galbraith Rd. Turn right onto Winton Rd. Follow Winton approximately 1.2 miles to Compton Rd. Turn right onto Compton Rd.

### **From the West**

Take I-275 to the Ronald Reagan Highway. Go east to the Winton Rd. North exit (second Winton Rd. exit). Follow Winton Rd. approximately 1 mile to Compton Rd. Turn right onto Compton Rd.
