- Methods of Work. A ‘methods of work’ is a short presentation of ideas that you can use in your shop, similar to the subscriber shop tips in the front of magazines. At each meeting we try to have a number of these short presentations by members on various topics. Even if you have a process that you think everyone knows, they probably don’t (just look at handy hints published in the magazines each issue). Sign up at any meeting and you’ll be added to the list to present at a future meeting. Topics can include: Safety, Sharpening, New (or handy) tools or materials, Jigs and Fixtures, Finishing or general Shop Tips.

Museum Visit

Bill Fee spent the summer building display cases for the Kentucky Gateway Museum in Maysville, Ky. The cases are for the museum's 1/12 scale miniature collection. The collection is now open to the public and he is arranging a visit on January the 19th. Bill Robertson, museum designer and miniature maker will be there to give us a tour of the collection and do a slide presentation of some of his work and tool collection.

The work there is very impressive, very high end miniatures, Some of the houses are valued at six figures. There is a reproduction of Princess Diana's childhood home with all the furnishings, and many other displays that will grab your attention. In the case of Bill Robertson's work, the miniature is built the same way as the original pieces. If there are dovetails in the original piece, then there are 1/12 scale dovetails in the miniature.

The plan is for everyone to arrange your own car pool and meet at the museum at 11:30 am on the 19th. The address is: 215 Sutton Street Maysville, Ky. 41056. Feel free to bring a spouse or guest. My wife and several of her friends have already visited and some have gone back for a second time.
