Agenda for November 13, 2021

The November meeting is presented by the Southeast group. Please take necessary personal and food precautions if you are not vaccinated or immunocompromised. Members are encouraged to wear protective masks.

#### Featured Speaker

The featured presenter at the November meeting will be Paul Sanow.

Paul is a member of the club and his main emphasis is traditional woodworking and historical reproductions. He is a member of SAPFM (Society of American Period Furniture Makers). Paul will discuss his process for building a candle stand inspired by research materials, including *Crafting Excellence: The Furniture of Nathan Lumbard and His Circle*. He will show how he took the information available in photographs to approximate the shape and form of the stand, using rules of proportion to fill in the gaps where images are not always definitive. The Lumbard candle stand design includes a spirited and complicated "arabesque" inlay design, bandings, turning, and carving. If time allows he will detour into related topics such as traditional drawer construction and his shellac / wax finishing techniques.

# **Methods of Work**

Keith Mealy will show a variety of cross-cut tables that he has built and used. He finds these so useful that he hardly ever uses a miter gauge on his saws. (He thinks he still has it somewhere).
