Ken Neaman, a CWC Member is familiar to most of us for his previous presentations on various topics including personalizing your pieces, making sculpted furniture legs, and including secret compartments. This time he will tell us about this unique Tiger Maple Buffet/Chest of Drawers he designed and built. Too big to conveniently haul to meetings, this project was evaluated as the best by the traveling judging team. The club awarded Ken the Fred Weissborn prize last season. This piece has Chippendale qualities about it and Ken will explain how it evolved and show us details as well as fixtures created for it.

Safety Requirements for Toys

<u>NO FINISH OF ANY KIND</u> even though you believe it is "safe". This includes printed decals and felt pen decoration.

NO VINYL PARTS

<u>SMALL PARTS</u> Check for small parts whether attached, removable or as a separate piece using the small parts test cylinder. Area group leaders have test cylinders available or bring parts to the meeting. If attached, small parts must be firmly secured to resist 15 lb pulling force. We recommend using two different securing methods on small parts, for example glue plus nail or screw. Pull testing is available at the meeting.

<u>CORDS, ROPE, STRING</u> Pull cords for pull toys can be of any length but they cannot have any knots, ball or handle on the pull end. Pull end of cord cannot exceed the diameter of the cord itself.

Cords, rope or string other than pull cords must be less than 12 inches in length

COMMUNITY SERVICE PROJECTS

Jim Schaefer Toy Project 2013

It's that time of the year again. We will be taking toys to Mt Vernon right after our November meeting. If you have completed toys for this year please bring them to the November meeting. More information in the next news letter. If you would like to make toys it's not too late. The following is helpful information.

Favorite Toys.

Feedback from the Director of the Christian Appalachian Project indicates the following toys as favorites among the children.

- 1. Pull Toys
- 2. Workable dump trucks or bulldozers
- 3. Three car carriers
- 4. Wooden puzzles
- 5. Cradle and dolls

Requirements for toys:

- No finish of any kind, even though you believe it is "safe"
- Small parts must be firmly attached to resist 15 lb pulling force. We recommend glue, and where possible, cross-fasteners such as brads.
- Removable parts on toys used by children under three must pass the cylinder test. Group leaders have these available for borrowing.
- Pull cords can be around 17 inches as long as the end of the cord is plain (no knots or handle).

Toy Making Supplies.

We have the following toy making supplies.

- 1. 1. Wheels from 1 to 2 inches
- 2. 2. 1/4, 3/8 and 1/2 inch dowels
- 3. 3. Axle pegs
- 4. 4. One, 1 1/4, and 1 1/2 inch balls
- 5. 5. Locomotive stacks
- 6. 6. Two inch split balls
- 7. 7. 1/2 x 3/4 inch various colored beads
- 8. 8. Various toy plans.

Any toy maker that would like to have a supply of these items please contact John Leonardi at 513-921-2027. You can either pick these up from him or the following individuals have some of the supplies Larry Lockwood, Earl North or Terry Elfers. If anyone can think of a toy making item that you would like, we may be able to reimburse you for the item. Just contact John. Dusty and Howard have retired from taking the toys to Mt. Vernon in November. Bob Steiner has volunteered to take them if his company van is available. We need a backup plan. We need a volunteer to drive a rented van to Mt Vernon. Please let John know if you are willing to do this.
