Program Presentation

Club member Stephen Fridrick installed a new dust collection system in his shop. He will share the research he did and the design and installation of a dust collection system.

Methods of Work.

At each meeting we have a series of short presentations with ideas that you can use in your shop, similar to the subscriber shop tips in the front of magazines. If you have something you'd like to share, there is a sign-up sheet at the meeting. Topics can include: Safety, Sharpening, New (or handy) tools or materials, Jigs and Fixtures, Finishing or general Shop Tips.

At this meeting Ray Ladouceur will present some findings on the pros and cons of using gloves in the workshop, specifically on table saw operations.
