Chris Schwarz will present our program. He will discuss how to use conical mortise-and-tenon joints that only get better and tighter with age. He will also demonstrate a finish called Shou Sugi Ban. You do it with a torch and wax. Both the joints and finish are used on this stool. Many of you know Chris as a teacher, author, proprietor of Lost Art Press, his appearances on *The Woodwright's Shop*, and from his days at Popular Woodworking, where he's still a contributing editor.
