Featured presentation Post and...?

University of Cincinnati Assistant professor of industrial design, and RISD MFA in furniture design graduate, John Dixon, approaches teaching furniture design first by choosing the intended relationship between parts. Drawing inspiration from architecture, American vernacular, and mid-century Danish furniture, John uses tried and true structural typologies to form a foundation for his teaching, and encourages his students to find the place to play within them. This talk will include examples of John’s work, and that of his students, critical references for those venturing into design, and a handful of demonstrations both in Computer Aided Drafting (CAD), and the use of hand tools for design refinement.

Methods of Work

We will have Methods of Work –Dick Lenz and Larry Saupe will present Shooting Boards. They will talk about designs, planes used, upgrades, accessories and a demonstration.

Parking Information

There are multiple places to find a parking spot.

- Handicap parking by the Reading Rd side of the receiving docks and on Benson St in front of the store. Handicap permits only. Receiving dock is available to unload and pick up items. Once unloaded, you must find other parking.
- Lot across the street from Mueller. Lot has parking spaces striped with Entrance and Exits marked. About 25 to 30 spaces.
- Mueller upper customer lot for May and September meeting only (when store not open to public). About 12 spaces
- Street parking on Mueller side of Benson and both sides on 3rd Street, north and south of Benson
