### **For Sale**

#### **Cordless brad nailer for sale, "only used once."**

Club member Ken Neaman (513-521-8890) writes:

A summer project this year was to replace screening on the porch of our sixty year old home. There were no removable panels, so all screening was permanently affixed, and this meant hundreds of feet of molding to replace. Faced with the specter of driving hundreds of finish nails, drilling pilot holes, and/or splitting trim pieces, I chose to buy a brad nailer for this one-time job.

I purchased a Ryobi P320, 18 volt, ONE+ brad nailer. This gun is battery powered, requires no compressor, and is capable of shooting up to 1700 nails per charge. Ryobi calls this AIR STRIKE Technology. I did not know these things even existed, and was certainly skeptical, but, much to my surprise, this little gun performed really well. I was using 1 1/4 inch nails, but the gun will handle up to 2 inch nails, and the depth of the nail strike is adjustable. Other than a couple of splits because I was trying to drive too close to the end of a piece, this tool did exactly as I had hoped.

The gun was purchased on August 8, for a total outlay of \$173.98 plus taxes. This amount includes the battery and charger, and nails, of which approximately 700 remain. The gun was on sale for \$50. off. I have the original sales slip, and am looking to sell all for \$100. I will even offer a money back guarantee if the buyer isn't satisfied that this is a very handy tool for smaller nailing jobs.
