The meeting will feature a presentation by Nancy R. Hiller. Nancy is a professional woodworker in Bloomington, Indiana. She has written for Popular Woodworking, Fine Woodworking, Lost Art Press, Fine Homebuilding and other publications. She has also written several books. Her latest is on English Arts and Crafts Furniture. This will be the subject of her presentation. As you will find out, A&C is much more than Morris Chairs and Limbert Tables.



Nancy trained as a furniture maker in England, where she lived for 16 years. After earning a City and Guilds of London certificate she worked for Roy Griffiths, a Slade School of Art-trained designer, building old pine kitchens at his Crosskeys Joinery. She later worked for Millside Cabinetmakers and briefly in the carpentry shop of the [Imperial War Museum](#) at Duxford Airbase before returning to the United States. Here she worked for [Wall-Goldfinger](#) and Credence Custom Furniture before opening NR Hiller Design, Inc. in 1995. She has taught cabinetmaking, furniture, and finishing courses at [Kelly Mehler's School of Woodworking](#) and Marc Adams School of Woodworking.
