2010-2011 Woodworking Contest

Build anything that is primarily made of wood and completed between September 2010 and May 2011. It will be judged by the same criteria used in our past contests. Originality of design (how unique is it?), Functionality of design (how well does it work?), Artistic design (is it attractive?), Finish (sanding, stain, top coat) and Expertise required to complete (complex angles, joinery, inlay etc.). Photos may be used to enter projects in cases where it is not practical to transport and display. A PowerPoint presentation will be used to display entry photos again this year when the contest is judged at the May 2011 meeting.

As part of the Woodworking Contest, we will present our 2nd annual Fred Weissborn Memorial Quality

Award. It will go to the woodworker whose Contest entry is voted by members to best reflect the craftsmanship demonstrated by Fred during his long tenure as a member. The selection criteria will follow the principle that "craftsmanship" is in the eye of the beholder. Each voting member will determine the superior craftsmanship as he or she sees it and pick the best entry. This award is a traveling trophy with the winner's name and project inscribed on it.

We congratulate Keith Neer as the first winner of this prestigious award in May 2010. At Keith's suggestion, the Steering Team has decided that a member may only win this award one time. A winner is ineligible to compete for this award in a future contest. However, a winner remains eligible to compete for any other contest awards.

Class Name: Table Building

Dates: Saturday, Sept. 25th and Sunday, Sept. 26th, 2010

Times: Saturday: 10:00 - 5:00

Sunday: To Be Coordinated With The Class To Accommodate Possible Church Schedules.

Note: we will need about 4 - 5 hours to complete the project on Sunday

Costs: Tuition \$120, Materials \$80

Class Size: Minimum (4), Maximum (8)

Tools Required: Wood chisels, tape measure, pencil, marking gauge, any others you want to drag along.

Optional Tools: Small shoulder plane, offset chisel.

SIGN UP DEADLINE IS NO LATER THAN SEPTEMBER 12, 2010!!!

This class is a great class for the woodworker who is getting started or wants to brush up on those basic skills required to build any size table. It is also excellent for seasoned woodworkers who want to pull many furniture construction skills into one concise project which can be completed in one weekend.

Each student will build and finish a small, black walnut, end table using basic construction techniques which are applicable to a wide range of furniture projects. Safety, equipment setup, design, leg tapering, joinery, glue up and finishing will be covered. Equipment utilized will include the jointer, planer, band saw, table saw, router, belt sander and others. Basic finishing techniques applicable to the basement or garage woodworker will also be covered.

This is truly a hands-on course which will challenge you and at the same time provide you with a finished project you will take home at the end of the course.
