Background

- Consumer Products Safety Commission Regulates Safety Standards (CPSA) for Children Toys
- Regulations are Age Specific
- CWC will use Regulations for Children under the age of 3
- CWC will concentrate on those Hazards that can severely injure a child or cause a fatality

Hazards


Choking
Small Parts
Ingesting
Small Parts
Toxins

- Strangulation
 - Cords
 - Entrapment



Small Parts

Determined by Small Parts Test Cylinder



Small Parts

- Can be a stand alone article
- A small part attached to a main part that comes detached
 - Any Small Part that can be grasped, must withstand a 15 lb Pull Test
 - Small Parts attachment to a main part, if possible, should use Redundant Securement

Ingesting

- Small Parts
 - Same requirement as Choking
- Toxins
 - Surface Coatings
 - Heavy Elements
 - Antimony, Arsenic, Barium, Cadmium, Chromium, Lead, Mercury, Selenium
 - Vinyl
 - Phthalates
 - Consumer Products Safety Improvement Act of 2008 requires third party testing on all surface coatings and vinyl
 - CWC will not use any surface coatings or vinyl

Strangulation

- Cords
 - Length of 12 inches or less
 - Pull Toys are permitted with longer cords but can not have any loop, knot, ball, bead or handle on the grasping end

TMA voluntary standard is 17 inches

 12 inch lengths of cords can be connected using a break away mechanism of less than 5 lb force

Strangulation

Entrapment

- Any situation where a child's head can be trapped cutting off oxygen supply
 - Slat opening must be less than 2 ¹/₂ inches

Other Areas of Concern

- No Splinters
- No Sharp Edges
- No Sharp Points
